The Roping Division features the best female ropers in the WPRA competing in team roping (header and heeler), tie-down roping and breakaway roping. World titles are awarded in each division as well as in the all-around category in which a competitor competes in more than one event winning more money than the rest of the field.

Sporting a small but loyal membership (that is currently growing in numbers and events), the women of the Roping Division have the opportunity to compete at events all over the United States in search of a world title.

Standings, based on money won at the

approved and co-approved events, are kept just like they are in the barrel racing division. At the end of the year, the WPRA hosts a World Finals featuring top competitors from each of the roping events that gives each competitor one last chance to win enough money to capture a world title.

This section features the 2011 World Champions as well as listings of past champions not only in the roping events but in the roughstock events of bareback riding and bull riding, when that was offered through the WPRA.

#### Jackie Hobbs takes home All-Around and Team Roping Header world titles in 2011

hampionships pile up fast when you double them up each year. Just ask Stephenville, Texas, cowgirl Jackie Hobbs. Hobbs came to the WPRA for the first time in 2006, claiming the Rookie of the Year title in the Tie Down Roping.

She was just getting warmed up.

Beginning in 2008, Hobbs has claimed two WPRA World titles a year and added another two to her resume during the 2011 WPRA World Finals Rodeo held in Lincoln, Neb. She now holds eight titles and her fourth All-Around title puts her in rare company in the history of the WPRA. Only three cowgirls have won more All-Around championships: Wanda Bush (9), Jackie Worthington (6) and JJ Hampton (6).

Hobbs had the World title for Heading in the bag without roping a steer but the All-Around title was decided at the Finals. Without any all-around qualifying events prior to the World Finals, the event became a sudden death roping match to see who would claim pro rodeo's most coveted title.

Roping in all four disciplines (tie down, breakaway, team roping – heading and heeling) the tough all-around hand demonstrated exactly why she is the now four-time WPRA All-Around World Champ.

Hobbs won two events (tie down roping and

heeling) and placed fourth in the heading and fifth in the breakaway averages during World Finals competition.

"We had an awesome time," Hobbs says of the World Finals. "I traveled with Jaymee Roach, Se'Vette Early and [Hobbs' boyfriend] Clayton Hass. Everybody made money so it was good!"

Hobbs' run to her first team roping championship began in February at the famed Wildfire Ladies Open to the World Roping held in Salado, Texas. Teaming with super tough heeler Annette Hinkle, Hobbs won the roping for \$12,930 in earnings. She added to her lead at the Spicer Gripp Memorial in August and walked into Lincoln with an insurmountable \$9,000 lead over Jacque Woolman.

On the coronation run to the World title in the heading, Hobbs partnered with friend and hauling partner Roach. The pair placed in two go rounds and landed fourth in the average. Hobbs stuffed another \$724 into her Wranglers and on top of her year-end landslide win.

She finished the season with \$17,084, nearly \$10,000 ahead of the Reserve Champ, ironically her partner Roach.

For the fourth straight year, Hobbs dominated the tie down roping, winning three of four rounds and taking her fourth average win in her favorite event. She tied four calves in 48.9 seconds, fifteen seconds ahead of 2011 World Champ Kari Woodall. Hobbs banked \$2,126 in the tie down roping alone to finish as the Reserve Champion.

Roping behind Wyoming's Willow Raley, Hobbs claimed her second straight win in the team roping average at the World Finals (the first came as a header for World Champ Lari Dee Guy in 2010).

"This was the first time I had roped with Willow," said Hobbs who is sponsored by Equibrand, Ariat and Redmond Rock Minerals. "I went to Cheyenne (Frontier Days) this year to watch Clayton (a PRCA steer wrestler). I watched Willow rope there and thought that was awesome." Raley has her PRCA card and often competes at pro rodeos with her husband, Aaron.

Raley and Hobbs placed in all four rounds of competition in Lincoln en route to winning the average. They stopped the clock on four steers at 55.9 seconds and won \$1,966 apiece. Hobbs finished second in the world standings.

In the breakaway roping, Hobbs won a go with a 2.1 second run, placed in another and finished fifth in the average after roping four calves in 11.7 seconds. She collected \$1,255 in the breakaway and finished third in the final world standings.

She banked an impressive \$6,071 in official 2011 earnings during three days of roping competition in Lincoln. The closest cowgirl to her total was her partner Raley, who earned \$4,380. Roach finished third in the final All Around standings.

"That's pretty cool," Hobbs said of having the ladies who are challenging her for the All-Around title also be her partners. It's one of the quirks of rodeo in the WPRA that competitors for the All-Around title often find themselves roping together.

Perhaps Hobbs' favorite part of the week was the surprising effort of her six-year-old gelding T-Boy, registered as DS Sassy Shiner.

"He is my pride and joy!" Hobbs says, noting that she rode the gelding in Lincoln in the tie down, breakaway and heading. "I had never tie down roped on him in competition before that week. We took him to a jackpot on Tuesday and paid them to rope three practice calves and left for Lincoln the next day."

Hobbs trains horses for a living and has always been a fan of the equine athletes in the sport.

"He worked so good. I am proud of him."

In addition, Hobbs had high praise for the WPRA's introduction of the Bonus Round for the top finishers in the final world standings in each of the roping events. Held during the Saturday night performance, the Bonus Round offered a chance to showcase the WPRA's best ropers.

"It was a blast," Hobbs laughs. "It was one time, sudden death, no average so no safetying up. It was just go as fast as you can. It was so much fun."

Hobbs looked like she was having fun. The Bonus Round was the "Jackie Hobbs Show" as Hobbs won every event with the fastest times posted all week in every event. In the breakaway, her 2.0 took the victory. In the tie down, she broke the 10 second mark at 9.4 seconds.

Again behind Raley, she took the team roping for 6.1 seconds of work. On Saturday alone, Hobbs earned another \$750.

While obviously the All-Around title is still Hobbs' favorite to win, the driven cowgirl has set a goal to win titles in all her events.

"It means a ton to me," says Hobbs of the heading title. "But I would like to win a title in every event before I am done." With three tie down titles and now the heading, Hobbs can set her sights on the heeling and breakaway to complete her resume. Perhaps in 2012.

### Guy Successfully Defends Team Roping Heeling World Title

f roping championships were rocks, Lari Dee Guy could have built several castles by now. The Abilene, Texas cowgirl is one of the most accomplished ropers of our time and has collected more than her share of championships.

Though she had won at every level from junior rodeo up, Guy didn't join the WPRA until 2006. Since that time, she has captured three World titles prior to the 2011 WPRA World Finals – two in the breakaway roping (2008 & 2010) and one in the heeling (2010) – and has been a force in the race for average titles at the World Finals every year she has entered.

In 2011, Guy came to Lincoln, Neb., for the WPRA World Finals with a commanding lead in the heeling after a successful season that saw her place high at prestigious co-sanctioned events in Texas: the Windy Ryon in Saginaw and the Wildfire in Salado in particular. A year after winning the Wildfire, Guy took third in 2011 for the bulk of her WPRA winnings, \$4,800 won with Jacque Woolman.

With the 2011 World title in the heeling all but sewn up, and all the other accolades that Guy has won, how does the cowgirl stay motivated?

"At my age, it's a challenge to go every day," she laughs. Though far from the ranks of the elderly, Guy is often roping against women half her age, many of them former students in one of her many clinics. "If I want to win something, I try to pursue it enough to get it done. I try to go at it 110-percent every day and do the best I can."

As her fellow competitors can attest, Guy's best is usually good enough to take a big chunk of the money. With the World title already hers

for the second straight year, Guy attacked the World Finals with her usual determination. Heeling for Tibba Smith, she placed in two go rounds and took home third in the average to add \$1,483 to her season total.


"I've known her since she was real little and she has helped me a lot through the years, riding horses for me," Guy says of Smith, who is the daughter-in-law of 2010 WPRA World Champ Barrie Smith and an accomplished roper in her own right.

"It was good," Guy says of the World Finals, in typically humble fashion. "I won a little in the breakaway and the team roping and we placed in the jackpots." In fact, Guy won third in the breakaway roping average along with two round checks, pocketing nearly \$1,000 in the breakaway alone.

In the jackpots held with the Finals, Guy cleaned up as well, taking home \$693 in the breakaway and \$1,254 in the team roping. Because the jackpot winnings count for the 2012 season, her earnings put her to the early lead in the All Around and Heeling championships. She is third in the breakaway roping standings.

For the 2011 season, Guy won \$9,108 heeling behind Barrie Smith, 2009 WPRA World Champ Se'Vette Early, Woolman, and her World Finals partner Tibba Smith at various all women's ropings.

"I roped pretty good this year but I owe it all to my good partners," says Guy. Respected throughout the roping industry not only for her ability with a rope but also for her horsemanship, she has trained some of the best roping horses around for both professional ropers and beginners alike. She usually has colts in for training and does training and tune-up for

top professional cowboys like PRCA World Champion Trevor Brazile.

Having Brazile's head horse around the barn has Guy thinking in a new direction for the 2012 season. For the first time, she is planning to only head at the Wildfire Ladies Championship in February.

"I sometimes struggle with my heeling," says Guy who is sponsored by Classic Equine, Timber Creek Vet Clinic, 5D Custom Hats and Leather and Outlaw Conversions. "So I thought

I might try heading and see how that goes. I've got some head horses around here and I head every day in the practice pen. It all just depends on the horses."

Since the team roping was split into heading and heeling, only one cowgirl, eight time World Champ Kim Williamson, has won both the heading and the heeling titles. That's one pursuit that Guy might well have an interest in chasing.

# Johnson wins first breakaway roping world title

rin Johnson knew she needed a good WPRA World Finals in order to win her first breakaway roping world championship.

Mission accomplished.


Johnson, who had just a \$218 lead over occasional traveling partner Willow Raley, placed in three of four go-rounds in Lincoln, Neb., finished in a tie for the average title with Cali Griffin and pocketed \$2,169 to walk away from the Lancaster Event Center with two coveted prizes – the world championship and the finals average title.

You'll forgive Johnson if she's a little giddy these days. She knew going in that being consistent is one of her strong points and is one of the big reasons she felt like she had an advantage in Lincoln.

"I really feel like roping a huge percentage of my calves has won me a lot of money over the years," Johnson said. "I don't win a lot of firsts, but it seems like I place a big percentage of the time. I think that's been pretty instrumental.

"I've won money on some calves you wouldn't think I should have. Sometimes those 4- and 5-second runs are big, because it does help in the end. It's like one big average roping."

Johnson fared a lot better than that. Her slowest run happened in the final go-round of the two-day competition, a 3.0-second run. It was the first time she didn't place during the association's championship event. It was quite impressive, but that's kind of year Johnson has had. You see, Denton Johnson was born Feb. 19 – that was the biggest thing that has happened

to Erin and her husband, Darnell.

Nobody knows if 10-month-old Denton Johnson will be a calf roper, but he'll definitely have all the opportunities.

Darnell is a finalist in the Mountain States Circuit, and his mom is a world champion breakaway roper. It definitely is in Denton's genes.

"Sometimes you have to get by on some you shouldn't win money on," Johnson said. "If you keep roping all of them, then sooner or later your chances are pretty good you're going to win something.

"I'll be the first to admit that I haven't done as good at that as I should have. There's dang sure been plenty of times that I've missed that it doesn't make me happy. What I hate more than anything is missing. You shouldn't miss ... ever."

That's the competitor coming out in Johnson.

But it's also a taste of a cowgirl who works very hard at her game. A part-time accountant for a builder group in Pueblo, Colo., Johnson has plenty of opportunities to perfect her craft. In addition to being married to a calf roper, she has the drive to reach for the stars.

"Roping is something you get into, and it, then, gets into your system," she said. "You love everything about it. It's a little like gambling; you can't quit, even when it's going bad. You know that next win is at your fingertips.

"You're not going to quit while you're down. Then, when it gets better, you keep going because it's so good."

Darnell and Erin have traveled together more this year than previously. They share the parenting duties and caring for the animals.

"That's been really nice to have him around," said Johnson, who collected the biggest part of her earnings at sanctioned events in Billings, Mont., and Clovis, N.M. "We have our baby, and it's nice just to be able to spend quite a bit of time together."

That's where family life and the world of rodeo intermix, and it's just another extension of a strong bond in the sport.

"There are so many good things about rodeo, about roping," she said. "The people, the friends ... everywhere I go, I'm excited to see the people I see. It's rewarding."

It's also gratifying to have a strong partner in Rio Sols, a 6-year-old gray gelding she calls Bubba. In fact, she had planned to use 2011 as a seasoning run for a younger horse, but after her early-spring runs, she decided to stick with her trusty mount.

"Since I had an opportunity to maybe win the WPRA, I decided to stick with Bubba," Johnson said. "I've really enjoyed roping on Bubba. My dad raised him, and I trained him. That's pretty rewarding to see him come along, get better and improve.

"It's rewarding for me. I still get really excited. I've made lots of good runs in my life, but every time I make one, I'm like a kid in a candy store."

It's that approach that has helped Johnson battle through the struggles and enjoy the victories that come with the sport.

"Nobody will say you love to lose, but in

# 2011 Tie Down Roping World Title worth the wait for Woodall

he's always had the smile of a World Champion. Now she has the gold buckle to go along with it.

Oklahoma's Kari Woodall is women's tie down roping's answer to the Cal Ripken, a humble, determined athlete who has outlasted several waves of ropers to still find her name amongst the leaders in the chase for the WPRA World titles year in and year out after 20 years of roping.

Twenty years is a long time for any athlete to wait to reach the pinnacle of their profession. Woodall rejuvenated her quest for a world title a couple of years ago with the purchase of a new horse, a once in a lifetime equine partner registered as Docs Spencer Roaneo whom she calls "G" because it's branded on him.

"It would take quite a horse to replace him for me," she says. "He is 11, still in his prime, so if I can keep from spoiling him, he will be OK." The gelding was trained by Tate Watkins and Woodall describes him as "all business."

Since buying G, Woodall has won quite a lot of money with his help at the WPRA roping, the Ultimate Calf Ropings, and the biggest tie down roping of them all, Joe's Boot Shop Roping.

In fact, it was Joe's Boot Shop Roping held annually in Clovis, N.M., that set Woodall hurtling toward her first World title. She won second against a field of 110 ropers, collecting \$2,186.

Woodall had the title all but in her hands prior to nodding for her first calf at the WPRA World Finals in Lincoln, Nebr., but pride and Woodall's amazing competitive spirit demand a top notch performance anyway.

She gave it. En route to her first World Championship during her 20th WPRA World Finals Rodeo, Woodall roped solid, winning third, second and fourth, respectively, in the three opening rounds.

"I choked," laughs Woodall of the fourth

calf, quickly ticking off all the mistakes she made. She roped the calf's head and front leg in her loop, which eventually ended up being just the front leg. "It was kind of a wrestling match after that!"

Despite the trouble on the final calf, she still won second in the average behind 2010 World Champion Jackie Hobbs. All tallied, Woodall stuffed an additional \$1,404 into her Wranglers towards the World title.

"It was good," says Woodall of the finals. "It was funny; the younger girls didn't realize that I had never won it before, so they didn't know why it was such a big deal! It was the first saddle I've ever won!"

As usual, Hobbs brought her "A" game to the Finals, collecting three round wins and the average win for the fourth straight year. Though she won \$2,126 for tying off four calves in 48.9 seconds, it was too little, too late to catch Woodall.

Woodall claimed her first championship with \$5,754 in earnings for the season. Hobbs would settle for the Reserve title with \$3,960.

"It's been a long time coming and it was a collective effort with my family and friends, helping with chores and things like that so I could go down the road," said Woodall. "I'm very thankful because I may never get to do it again."

Woodall and Hobbs put their skills to the test on Saturday night during the World Finals Bonus Round Performance. Hobbs took the head-to-head match with Woodall not far behind in the round that was reserved just for the top ropers in the final World standings to showcase their talents for the Saturday night crowd.

"The Bonus Round added that finals atmosphere to it and since all the pressure was off (the World titles were decided by then), everybody just went and had fun. It was the best rop-

ing of the week!" says Woodall. "It was fun."

Woodall banked some extra cash from the Bonus Round and got a start on the 2012 season by taking fourth in the jackpot held during World Finals week. All jackpot monies count toward the new season.

Don't expect to see the cowgirl in the trailer hauling for the repeat title, though. With a new business venture with her husband Marvin, Woodall is limiting herself to one event a month next year.

"I want to take more time at home with my family," she explains. "I am going to choose one a month and try to make them count.

"All of the women who compete at the WPRA are such wonderful people, nice friends to have. All of their congratulations and support for me made it extra special this year. I didn't want to leave."
