100	Dillon McPherson	18.2. The rodeo committee/personnel must provide a safe, quiet place away from the arena, alley, traffic, pedestrians and commotion for the testing area. If this type of area is not provided, each responsible member shall be allowed to select the area they feel safest for the testing of their horse. For example, the responsible members' horse trailer or stall. Responsible members will be allowed to cool their horses down and offer them water prior to testing. "Spotters" will be provided for the number of contestants being tested, in order to allow the cool down time and separation from the arena and high activity area. For example, if 3 contestants are being tested each performance, then 3 spotters or 2 spotters plus the vet will accompany the responsible member and their horse during the cool down and transfer to the safe testing area. A responsible member may request a urine test rather than a blood test, provided the horse urinates within an hour after competition.	In Review
