Not long after, she had a stroke caused by a blood clot that burst in the back of her brain, admitting her back into the hospital. The stroke mainly affected her vision and balance. Lorraine is recovering at home now, taking her recovery day by day. She and her family are very thankful for all of the prayers and support during this difficult time.
