Women's Professional Rodeo Association

76 years of Women in Rodeo

Crowning World Champions since 1948

The Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA) is the oldest women's sports organization in the country. The Association started in 1948 with a group of Texas ranch women who wanted to compete professionally as well as add a little color and femininity to the rough-and-tumble sport of rodeo. A major move at the time, 38 women met at the St. Angelus Hotel in San Angelo, Texas, on February 28, 1948, to change the way they were being treated in the male-dominated world of rodeo. These women banded together to create the very first professional sports association created solely for women by women – the Girls Rodeo Association (GRA).

The women knew they had an uphill climb to make a go of the association, but it was one they all wanted to try. The group's primary purpose was to give women legitimate, honest opportunities to compete in all-girl rodeos as well as to establish an alliance with the Rodeo Cowboys Association (RCA- later became the PRCA) to host women's events in conjunction with RCA-sanctioned rodeos. They drafted and approved rules and regulations, and they enacted a point system to crown world champions. Their rules took effect in May 1948, and GRA board members went to work, persuading rodeo committees and producers to hold women's contests according to GRA rules.

Committees were given the option of choosing which event they would hold (bronc riding, cutting or barrel racing), and most picked barrel racing. In its inaugural year, the GRA had 74 members and they held 60 events with a total payout of \$29,000. Two years later they had more than 100 members. Today, it is an association with more than 4,000 members and over 1,700 events with a total payout of over \$7 million.

In 1981, the GRA changed its name to the Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA) which continues to stand for the same ideals it stood for back in 1948 when it was first conceived as a tool to help like-minded women achieve their common goals.

Back in the early days of the National Finals Rodeo, where world titles are determined, the barrel racing was not held in conjunction with rest of the events but had its own championships at a different location. In 1959, the first year that the NFR existed, the barrel racing championships were held in Clayton, N.M., with the team roping and steer roping, while the other events were in Dallas. In 1960, the barrel racing and team roping events were held in Scottsdale, Ariz., and then in Santa Maria, Calif., in 1961. In 1962, the GRA decided to stand their ground and hold their finals in Ft. Worth without any RCA events at all. It would remain there until 1967 when Florence Youree met with Stanley Draper of Oklahoma City and asked him to include barrel racing with the NFR. During that meeting Stanley called Clem McSpadden and they decided to include the women and Draper agreed to put up \$1,000 prize money the first year. In 1968, Stanley Draper proposed that the barrel racing be held at the NFR as long as the NFR was in Oklahoma City with a minimum purse of \$2,500.

Although barrel racing was now included as an event at the NFR, they were still not paid the same as all the men's events. That all finally changed in 1998, when for the first time ever the barrel racing event paid out the same amount as all the men's events at the National Finals Rodeo in Las

Vegas. In fact, in 1999 two-time world champion Sherry Cervi took home more money in a single event than any other contestant competing at the finals-male or female. With \$245,369 in earnings for the year, Cervi topped the second place high money winner, Fred Whitfield who was crowned the 1999 All-Around and Calf Roping World Champion, by more than \$27,000. In 2013, Sherry Cervi placed in all 10 go-rounds, including three victories, and left Las Vegas with \$155,899 earned inside the Thomas & Mack Center, setting a WPRA record for most money won at the NFR at the time and collected her fourth WPRA world title with \$303,317 in 2013 season earnings. In fact, the Arizona cowgirl became just the fifth cowgirl in WPRA Wrangler NFR history to have placed in each go-round. In 2016, Amberleigh Moore moved from 15th to No. 2 after collecting \$187,692 in 10 days in Las Vegas, setting a new Wrangler NFR earnings record. The NFR earnings record is now held by Hailey Kinsel with \$270,615 set in 2020. Mary Burger would take home the world title in 2016 becoming the oldest male or female at the age of 68 years and 4 months to compete at the Wrangler NFR and win a world title. In 2017, Tiany Schuster set a new regular season WPRA earnings record with \$250,378, but in 2023 Brittany Pozzi Tonozzi surpassed that finishing the regular season with \$270,563. At the NFR in 2017, Hailey Kinsel set a new arena record at the Thomas and Mack with a 13.11-second run. In 2020, the event moved to Arlington, Texas and Globe Life Field due to the COVID-19 pandemic and Hailey Kinsel continued her dominance winning her third straight world title. She set an arena record and a new record on a WPRA standard pattern during the eighth round in a time of 16.56 seconds. She became the first WPRA member to win the world title, average title and RAM Top Gun Award all in the same year. In 2021, Jordon (Peterson) Briggs ran down her first world title and made history by joining her mother as a WPRA World Champion Barrel Racer – the first mother-daughter duo to win the title. Kinsel captured her fourth world title in 2022. Brittany Pozzi Tonozzi had a record-breaking year en route to her third world title in 2023. She finished the year just shy of an astonishing half a million dollars.

From the very beginning, women have stuck their necks out for equality with varying degrees of success. In the early days of rodeo, some cowtowns recognized the ability women possessed and ditched the beauty pageants typically held for cowgirls. Instead, they held contests such as bronc riding, cutting or barrel racing. But, those events were few and far between. From the early days of competing for a cigarette case to competing for thousands of dollars of added money and incentive programs provided by the sponsorships secured by the WPRA over the last several decades the face of women in rodeo has certainly changed. Today’s contestants are breaking records, influencing history and paving a bright future for the future cowgirls.

The Association has come a long way in 76 years. The benefits the contestants receive today would not have been imaginable had it not been for a courageous band of women who roughed it out in the early days of rodeo. In addition, that courage would have been fruitless if it weren’t for the leaders who have stepped forward to accept the WPRA’s baton year after year. Their refusal to take “no” for an answer serves to inspire future generations to recognize and then work to harness the potential of women in rodeo, today, tomorrow and in the future. ***WPRA – Crowning World Champions since 1948.***

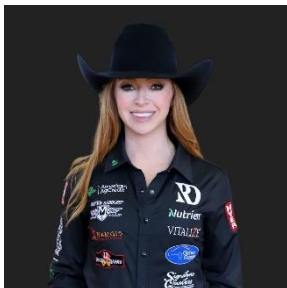

Career Highlights

- 2023 – Entered the Wrangler NFR ranked 3rd and finished the year ranked fifth with \$246,674. Placed in five out of 10 rounds winning the sixth round. Won the Governor's Cup in Sioux Falls, SD, winning \$43,750 on the last weekend of the regular season to move to No. 3 in the world standings. For the second time in her career, first was in 2019, finished as the highest money winning barrel racer over the Fourth of July known as Cowboy Christmas. Won \$25,277 during that week. Won the Ponoka (Alberta) Stampede, the Tri-State Rodeo (Amarillo, TX) and Duncan (OK) Pro Rodeo. Finished second at the Cinch Playoff Series in Puyallup, WA, at the Oregon Trail Rodeo (Hastings, NE), and the Pioneer Days Rodeo (Clovis, NM). Finished tied for second at the Buffalo Bill Rodeo (North Platte, NE) and at Mt. Pleasant (TX) Rodeo. Finished third at Calgary Stampede
- 2022 – Entered the NFR ranked 9th and finished the year ranked 6th with \$221,718 after winning \$127,753 at the NFR, placing in 6 out of 10 rounds,



winning Rd 4 and tying for the win in Rd. 6. Crossed the \$1 million mark in career earnings following the NFR. Won New Mexico State Fair & Rodeo (Albuquerque), West Texas Fair & Rodeo (Abilene), Bennington (KS) PRCA Rodeo and the 101 Wild West Rodeo (Ponca City, OK). Tied for second at Woodward (OK) Elks Rodeo and finished in a tie for second at ABC Pro Rodeo (Levelland, TX)

- 2021 – Entered the Wrangler NFR ranked 10th and finished the year ranked third after winning \$129,091 at NFR, tied for fourth in the average in a time of 146.83 second and placed seven out of 10 rounds – winning the fifth round in a time of 13.43 seconds. Finished the year ranked 3rd with \$202,565. Won the Seward County PRCA Rodeo (Liberal, KS), Eureka (KS) PRCA Rodeo, Cody (WY) Stampede, Dinosaur Days Rodeo (Vernal, UT), Flint Hills Rodeo (Strong City, KS) and The Haysville (KS) Saddle Club Rodeo. Finished second at Lawton (OK) Rangers Rodeo, at Will Rogers Memorial Rodeo (Vinita, OK) and at Angelina County Benefit Rodeo (Lufkin, TX)
- 2020 - Finished the year ranked fourth with \$159,427 after winning \$117,038 at the NFR after finishing fifth in the average in a total time of 177.72 seconds on 10 runs on a standard pattern and placed in four rounds including two first place finishes in the sixth and seventh rounds in times of 17.01 and 16.85, respectively. Won the year-end and average titles at the Prairie Circuit Finals Rodeo and qualified for the Ram National Circuit Finals Rodeo for the third time. Won the Days of '76 Rodeo (Deadwood, SD), Kansas' Largest Night Rodeo (Pretty Prairie), Rodeo Roundup (Roundup, MT) and Douglas County Fair & Rodeo (Castle Rock, CO). 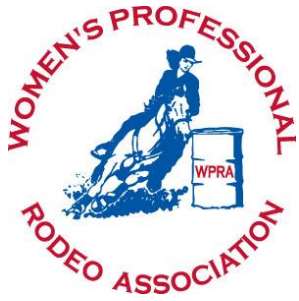

Women's Breakaway Roping History

Girls' breakaway actually first emerged in high school rodeo. The National High School Rodeo Association has been crowning a national champion since 1953. The event didn't appear in college rodeo until 1969. The WPRA had tie-down roping dating back to 1948 but added breakaway roping in the 1970's off and on until it was annual in 1989. The first-ever WPRA Breakaway Roping World Champion was Becky Berggen in 1974, followed by Becky Fuchs in 1975. A champion wouldn't be named again until 1982 when Pam Minick won the title.

In 2017, the breakaway ropers of the WPRA began making efforts to introduce their event into Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) events in the Columbia River Circuit (that includes the states of Oregon and Washington) with the hope this small spark would light a bigger fire within the industry. They introduced breakaway into iconic rodeos like Ellensburg, Washington and Pendleton, Oregon, and by 2019 the WPRA was sanctioning up to 30 breakaway roping events at PRCA rodeos. In 2024, WPRA sanctioned 500 breakaway roping events at PRCA rodeos.

In 2020, the WPRA in partnership with the PRCA agreed to open it up to any sanctioned rodeo wanting to add breakaway roping to their list of events bringing a new spotlight to the event as never before. The WPRA started keeping standings for breakaway events held at PRCA sanctioned rodeos versus those events co-approved by the WPRA. As a result, in 2020 the WPRA World Champion Breakaway Roper will be determined by the ProRodeo standings instead of the traditional WPRA co-approved standings. As a result of the WPRA and PRCA partnership women breakaway ropers now have more opportunities, and the two Associations are working to make the event more "rodeo mainstream."

EVENT DESCRIPTION

Don't blink or you may just miss the run. In breakaway roping, the cowgirl has a flag tied close to the end of her rope and a nylon string tied from the rope to the saddle horn. Once the barrier is released and the calf leaves the roping chute, the cowgirl gives chase throwing the loop around the calf's neck. When the rope grows tight after the calf is roped, the string breaks away from the saddle horn and the flag goes flying, signaling the timer to stop the clock. The time in the breakaway roping can sometimes get as fast as 1.6 seconds and since it is a timed event, the fastest time wins. A broken barrier results in a 10-second penalty.
